

Monitoring and Reporting Violation
Failure to Submit a Disinfectant Level Quarterly Operating Report
(DLQOR) MONITORING, ROUTINE (DBP), MAJOR/CHLORINE

The Bolivar WSC water system PWS ID 0610049 has violated the monitoring and reporting requirements set by Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) in Title 30, Texas Administrative Code (30 TAC), Section 290, Subchapter F. Public water systems are required to properly disinfect water before distribution, maintain acceptable disinfection residuals within the distribution system, monitor the disinfectant residual at various locations throughout the distribution system, and report the results of that monitoring to TCEQ on a quarterly basis.

Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water is safe from microbial contamination.

This/These violation(s) occurred in the monitoring period(s): First Quarter, January 1, 2013 – March 31, 2013

We are taking the following actions to address this issue: Make sure quarterly reports are filed in a timely manner. First Quarter was filed past the due date. Subsequent quarters have been filed on time and all residual and bacteriological test were done and approved. The water was safe at all times. This was a clerical error and this notice is being sent to comply with TCEQ regulations.
